Graduate School Preparation

- ❖ We will help you build connections with faculty and graduate chairs in the department in your field.
- ❖ We will arrange for you to observe a variety of classes with other UH Mānoa students and participate in class activities.
- ❖ We will provide a workshop for you to engage with members from the Graduate Student Organization (GSO) and learn about the student governance and student life at UH Mānoa.
- We will organize workshops to offer advising on how to apply to UH Mānoa through different pathway programs.
- ❖ The English teacher will guide you on how to professionally present yourself and your work to faculty members and classmates.

- ❖ We take you on a hike in the most historic sites on Oahu to enjoy nature and beauty of thiis tropical island.


Off-Campus Excursions

Lyon Arboretum Visit:

The Harold L. Lyon Arboretum is nestled in 193.5 acres of tropical rain forest at the top of the Manoa Valley watershed. Lyon Arboretum serves as a cultural and scientific resource to urban O'ahu's diverse communities.

Iolani Palace:

Iolani Palace is a living restoration of a proud Hawaiian national identity and is recognized as the spiritual and physical multicultural epicenter of Hawai'i. Built in 1882 by King Kalakaua, Iolani Palace was the home of Hawai'i's last reigning monarchs and served as the official royal residence and the residence of the Kingdom's political and social life until the overthrow of the monarchy in 1893. Registered as a National Historic Landmark since 1962 and the only official royal residence in the United States, the Palace is one of the most recognizable buildings in Hawai'i.

Student Dorm

All Summer UP students will stay in private dorm rooms at the Student Housing on campus. The dorm building is only one minute walking to the classrooms. The dorm building also has its own kitchen at each floor.

Dining

The Summer Up program fee covers two meals a day from July 14 to July 26. The dining hall will be in the Hale Aloha Hall which is only 5 minutes walking from the Hale Aloha dorm building. The meals will be served as a buffet with a veriety of food choices.

Transportation

We provide free suttle service to the Summer UP participants including airport pick-up and drop-off, and the Lyon Arboretum.

Student Services

There will be at least two faculty (Dennis & Ivy) providing advising services to all Summer UP participants. A 2019 Summer UP Wechat will be created for students to ask questions or seek help.









Program Tuition & Fees: \$ 2,120 Program Application Fee: \$100 (non-refundable)

The \$2,220 Summer UP tuition and fees includes the academic classes, dorms, dining, airport pick-up/drop-off, graduation luncheon, and other scheduled activities listed on the 2019 Summer UP Calendar. Students will be responsible for the US-China round-trip airfare, local transportation for things that are not scheduled by the Summer Up Program, and additional activities in Hawai'i.

Application Deadline

The application deadline for the 2019 Summer Up Program is April 30th.

Applicants who need to cancel the program application will get 100% refund until May 15th, 2019 and 75% May 16th to June 15th. No refund will be givin after June 15th.

Visa Information

UH Mānoa provides invitation letters to assist participants in applying for an American 182 visitor visa. The participants are responsible for the cost of the visa application.

Health Insurance

Health insurance is required for all international students on the UH Mānoa campus. Participants are responsible for the purchase of their health insurance. If the insurance is not purchased in advance, students will be required to purchase the insurance upon arrival at UH Mānoa campus.
